








Dr. Pravin Mundhe (IPS), DCP Zone 1

Avkash Jadhav is an academician, historian, and activist for civil rights, heritage & environment. He heads the Department of History at St. Xavier's College (Empowered Autonomous), Mumbai serves as the Founder-Trustee of a Mumbaibased NGO, KAASH Foundation. Under his leadership the NGO is working in the tribal villages of Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh. Dr. Jadhav was a Gold Medalist in BA History and he pursued his PhD on The Labour Movement in Bombay: A Historical Study (1920 to 1945). He recently completed his Second Postdoctoral Program on New Technologies, Social Sciences and Law (First Postdoctoral Program in Globalisation and Human Rights), from the Mediterranean International Centre for Human Rights Research (MICHR), Italy.

For over 30 years, he has taught undergraduate and postgraduate students subjects like History, Human Rights, and Human Values. Dr. Jadhav has also been invited as a Keynote & Valedictory Speaker, Resource Person, and Chairperson to more than 350 International and National Conferences. He has over 46 publications in various international & national research journals and also Six books to his credit. He is also a subject expert on the Censor Board of India and invited to conduct sessions on various Pedagogical Skills, Unconventional Teaching Methods, Application of Academic Research Surveys for Policy Making, etc. and also to train students of Civil Services. He is also the Former Municipal Councillor of BMC and was ranked in Top 10 councillors in the city for his performance and policies, out of 232 councillors. He is also the Former Trustee of CSMVS, Museum. He has received more than 21 National and International awards for his social work including from iCongo United Nations. He represented India in the SAARC Conference at Colombo and Afghanistan, World Peace Summit at South Korea, Special Delegate to Israel, in the BRICS Conference. He is the recipient of the Asiatic Fellowship and also Research Scholar of the Indian Council of Historical Research, New Delhi. National Gallery of Modern Art, Mumbai

The National Gallery of Modern Art, Mumbai was opened to the public on 23rd December, 1996. It is located in the precincts of the former auditorium the Sir Cowasji Jehangir Public Hall (C. J. P. Hall) and the Institute of Science. It is a subordinate office of the Ministry of Culture, Government of India. This architecturally marvellous building was designed and built by the famous British architect George Wittet in 1911. Only the facade remains of the edifice that was formerly the auditorium known as the Sir Cowasji Jehangir Public Hall. This building has been completely redesigned by the famous architect Romi Khosla giving it a spiral spin. The interior with its elegant horse - shoe shaped balconies now exhibits a different look as the hollow interior exhibits a central stairway with semicircular galleries at different levels. Sir C. J. Hall, as it was popularly known, has been transformed into the National Gallery of Modern Art, Mumbai. NGMA, Mumbai is home to an incredible collection of one thousand four hundred and fifty-six art works include paintings, sculptures, graphics and photographs. While the permanent collection includes both Indian and international artists, special focus has been on the Bombay Progressive Artists which includes the artists S.H. Raza, V. S. Gaitonde, Akbar Padamsee, Ram Kumar, F. N. Souza and more. However, true to its ethos as an institution that is resolutely focused on Indiai's contemporary art landscape. NGMA, Mumbai has a great tradition of hosting several spectacular exhibitions in the past, which continues till date. Some of the recent exhibitions include the highly successful Bombay Art Society exhibitioni which covered the landscape of the historic Bombay Art Society existence over 125 years. NGMA, Mumbai also has an impressive auditorium where film screenings and several outreach events are conducted for all age groups, regularly, in order to promote art and culture of India. NGMA, Mumbai organizes outreach activities for diverse category of museum visitors i.e. art and crafts workshops for children and adults, guided gallery walks and programmes for underprivileged children, events to mark commemorative days, expert talks and panel discussions, guided tour, film screenings and cultural programmes at the auditorium.

KAASH Foundation is a Mumbai based non-governmental organization (NGO) working on the four verticals of E2 H2 viz. Education, Environment, Health and Heritage. The Foundation was registered on 3rd October 2019 under the Bombay Trust Act, 1950. Founded by Dr. Avkash Jadhav and registered with NITI Aayog, Government of India, the Foundation primarily works towards organizing training & development programs in academics, health & naturopathy camps, and women empowerment programs; creating environmental awareness; and preserving tangible & intangible heritage. The Foundation has become strived to a CHANNEL TO EMPOWER WITH always KNOWLEDGE. With this perspective, the Centre for Academic and Professional Development (CAPD) was inaugurated on 25th May 2020 by Dr. Avkash Jadhav as its Director and Dr. Geeta Ajit as its Coordinator. The CAPD works as an allied body for KAASH Foundation's academic endeavours. Under its aegis, the Foundation has organised 19 International Conferences / Symposiums and 3 International Faculty Development Programs. Since 14th November 2021, the Foundation has been working on its Rural and Tribal Community Outreach Programs in the rural & tribal areas of Vikramgad, Palghar District, Maharashtra, to curb malnutrition in women and children living in the vicinity. On 14th November 2021, the Foundation adopted 150 malnourished children from Vikramgad and regular health / yoga / naturopathy camps were held to improve their health. Additionally, on 14th November 2023, the Foundation adopted 100 adolescent girls with an aim to improve their health as well as to facilitate their educational aspirations. Apart from this, it also aims to make people, especially women, self-reliant through a series of financial literacy programs and vocational courses, and encourage girls to complete their education and pursue a career in order to avoid early marriages & pregnancies and decrease mortality rate.
