# HARMONY IN DIVERSITY: DR. AVKASH JADHAV'S PARTICIPATION IN THE 9TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE SEPTEMBER 18<sup>TH</sup> HWPL WORLD PEACE SUMMIT

World peace is a collective aspiration transcends geographical boundaries, cultural differences, and political ideologies. It represents a state of harmonious coexistence where nations, communities, and individuals resolve conflicts through dialogue and cooperation rather than resorting to violence or aggression. The quest for world peace encompasses the promotion of justice, equality, and human rights on a global scale. World peace is not just a final destination or an abstract concept to be achieved in the distant future. Instead, it emphasizes that peace is an on-going process, a continuous journey that requires active participation and effort in every moment of our lives.

In pursuit of world peace, organizations like Heavenly Culture, World Peace, Restoration of Light (HWPL) play a significant role in translating the collective aspiration for global harmony into actionable initiatives. Founded in 2013 by Chairman Man Hee Lee, a Korean war veteran and peace advocate, HWPL operates on the principle that peace is not merely a distant goal but a journey requiring continuous effort and participation. Central to HWPL's mission is the Declaration of Peace and Cessation of War (DPCW), a comprehensive legal framework addressing conflict resolution, international law, human rights, and disarmament. Through peace walks, forums, and collaboration with governments and organizations worldwide, HWPL actively engages individuals, community leaders, and policymakers in fostering awareness and support for the DPCW, contributing to the on-going journey towards world peace.

Every year, on the 18th of September, the organization orchestrates its World Peace Summit, a significant event dedicated to fostering global harmony. This particular year held special significance as it marked the 9th Anniversary of the Summit, signifying years of commitment to the cause of peace. Dr. Avkash Jadhav, Founder-Trustee, KAASH Foundation, had the honour of receiving an invitation to serve as a distinguished representative of not only the Foundation but also the country.

On 18th September 2023, the World Peace Summit commenced with an inspiring morning, resonating with positive energy from global scholars and leaders. Chairman Han Lee of HWPL organized the inauguration, featuring leaders and policymakers worldwide. The day focused on discussions, talks, and workshops dedicated to promoting global peace education. A memorable conclusion comprised panel and group discussions involving scholars from diverse nations. The theme, "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" (The World is One Family), echoed, emphasizing

unity. Representing India, the participant highlighted the nation's historical commitment to peace, drawing on Hindu philosophy, Buddhism, and Mahatma Gandhi's principles. The day fostered meaningful connections with international figures, promoting the exchange of ideas and constructive energy.

On 19<sup>th</sup> September 2023, the day commenced with an inspiring address by religious leaders worldwide, setting a harmonious tone further enhanced by a Peace Song performed by children. The day unfolded with fruitful discussions and the exchange of ideas among individuals representing diverse religious groups, directors, and ministers. The collective efforts for peace resonated strongly, showcasing the dedication of people from various countries and cultural backgrounds.

Later in the day, participants explored the enchanting Fairy Tale Village in Songwoldong, Incheon. Initially an ageing village, it underwent a remarkable transformation in 2013 as part of an urban regeneration project. The village was reorganised and adorned with characters and backgrounds from Korean traditional and worldfamous fairy tales, creating an immersive experience. Sculptures and murals depict stories from Little Red Riding Hood to Beauty and the Beast, making it a vibrant tourist attraction. The village's threedimensional, recycled decor brought childhood tales to life, creating a nostalgic and unreal yet real atmosphere. Residents continued to inhabit Songwol-dong, emphasizing the coexistence of a fairy tale village with everyday life. Visitors were encouraged to enjoy the experience responsibly, appreciating the lives of residents without causing disturbance. The urban regeneration project, initiated in 2013, successfully transformed Songwoldong into Donghwa Village, breathing new life into the once-declining area. Its thematic roads, including Dorothy Road and Little Red Riding Hood Road, added to the charm of the village, making it a favourite tourist spot in Incheon.

The day concluded with a Wolmido Cruise Ship tour, showcasing the coastal waters of Incheon. The cruise included a visit to Palmido Island, recognized for Korea's first lighthouse, and offered both daytime sea exploration and a breath-taking nightscape with onboard fireworks. Overall, the day














blended cultural exploration, discussions for peace, and immersive experiences.

On 20<sup>th</sup> September 2023, the focus shifted to a comprehensive exploration of Korea's military history with a visit to the War Memorial of Korea in Yongsandong, Seoul. This monumental museum, inaugurated in 1994 on the former site of the army headquarters, serves as a tribute to Korea's military past and endeavours to impart lessons from the Korean War while fostering a vision of peaceful reunification

between North and South Korea.

The museum comprises three above-ground floors and two underground floors, covering an expansive area of approximately 20,000 m<sup>2</sup>. The exterior features black marble monuments inscribed with the names of individuals who lost their lives in conflicts such as the Korean War, Vietnam War, clashes with North Korea, and duty-related police fatalities. A central plaza houses the evocative "Statue of Brothers," depicting a South Korean soldier and a North Korean

soldier, symbolizing the division of Korea. Inside, the museum boasts seven halls, including the Memorial Hall, War History Room, Korean War Room, Expeditionary Forces Room, ROK Armed Forces Room, Exhibition Hall for Donated Artefacts, and Exhibition of Large Military Equipment. With over 6,300 items on display, the exhibitions span from prehistoric weaponry to modern military equipment, featuring a diverse range of weapons, aircraft, and armoured vehicles.

The day's second half was dedicated to connecting with delegates from the World Peace Summit, fostering collaboration and dialogue for a more peaceful future. The immersive visit to the War Memorial underscored the historical context in which these peace-building efforts transpired, reinforcing the commitment to preventing future conflicts.

On 21st September 2023, the World Peace Summit concluded with a final session. The latter part of the day was dedicated to exploring sites and markets in Seoul. The evening was marked by the reception of numerous honours, and exchanges of pleasantries added a celebratory touch to the event.

From 22<sup>nd</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> September 2023, Dr. Avkash Jadhav toured the island of Jeju in South Korea to study its heritage. The visit was a captivating exploration of this unique destination steeped in natural and cultural heritage. Jeju, known as the "Treasure Island," is renowned for its exceptional beauty, designated as one of the 7 Natural Wonders of the World, a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, World Natural Heritage, and Global Geopark. Upon arrival, Dr. Jadhav experienced the well-organized Jeju Airport, reflecting the island's commitment to promoting tourism. The courteous staff at the seaside hotel, Grim Resort, further enhanced the comfort of the stay.

Exploring the island revealed its rich natural wonders. The UNESCO World Heritage site of Manjanggul Cave, with its colossal dimensions and well-preserved lava formations dating back 300,000 to 200,000 years, showcased the geological heritage of Jeju. The stunning beaches, including Hamdeok and Woljeongri, provided not only picturesque landscapes but also a glimpse into the cultural and recreational heritage of the island. # FINANCIAL LITERACY WORKSHOP AT VIKRAMGAD

Women are one of the stakeholders for the stability and all round development of a society. But since antiquity, we have witnessed exploitation and oppression undertaken against women. One of the primordial reasons for this is the sheer dependence of women on their family or male counterparts, especially in financial terms. And it is the duty of responsible civil society to educate and make women financially independent and most importantly financially literate. Financial literacy is immensely vital and resourceful for women because it will make women capable with respect to efficient spending, long-term planning, investment, and even during emergency circumstances.

Therefore as a step towards promoting financial awareness women, among KAASH Foundation organised a Financial Literacy Workshop for the anganwadi sevikas of Vikramgad. Anganwadi Sevikas are supervisors of the anganwadis in Vikramgad where children from 1 – 5 years of age are cared for while their parents are at work. Not only are they cared for, but they are also educated and provided with healthy food by the sevikas. However, they are compensated with a very meagre amount and struggle to make ends meet. The sevikas have been playing a pivotal role in the Foundation's project at Vikramgad through their support and assistance in conducting activities in the vicinity. And therefore, the Foundation deemed it important to empower them to become financially independent and self-reliant. Held on 15th August 2023 at the Vikramgad Panchayat

Samiti, the workshop was conducted by Dr. Avkash Jadhav, Founder-Trustee, KAASH Foundation, and was attended by over 300 *anganwadi sevikas* from various villages of Vikramgad.

Dr. Jadhav spoke to the women about the significance of money management, which will in turn be resourceful for them and their families. Secondly, he spoke about the modalities in which the *anganwadi sevikas* can invest and save their money. He also systematically explained the process and enlisted the benefits that the women could yield, even when they receive minimum wage. Dr. Jadhav told them about mutual funds, which could be one of the mediums

apart from fixed deposits for maintaining savings.

After which, the *anganwadi sevikas* expressed their interest to start their own home businesses. They had a vision, but no proper assistance and guidance to fulfil their dreams. Therefore, the Foundation has decided to start a program where it will serve as a mediator between the *anganwadi sevikas* and monetary agencies to help them with money management.

In this way, the workshop was insightful and immensely helpful for the *anganwadi* sevikas to know about money management and various methods of saving.
