Dignitaries included Dr. Katke, a famous gynaecologist from Mumbai, who formerly served as the Medical Superintendent at Cama Hospital and is currently the Head of Department at J.J. Hospital. Also gracing the event were entrepreneurs Ms. Kavita Kapoor and Arjuna Awardee Ms. Shivani Parab (in the Mallakhamb category). The function was attended by over 45 women of the KAASH Foundation Family.

The third edition, in 2023, was held at a resort in Virar, exclusively for the women of the KAASH Family. The special guest for this event was Ms. Sneha Jawale, an activist of international acclaim and a survivor of domestic violence. Having been set on fire by her own husband, she



survived to become a renowned activist, whose active opposition to atrocities against women is known to many. This day-long event witnessed the participation of over 20 members.

The fourth and the latest edition in 2024, worked to promote the welfare of anganwadi sevikas in the Vikramgad taluka of the Palghar district of Maharashtra. The Foundation was working towards this over the last three years, identifying anganwadi sevikas whose dedicated efforts had led to exemplary results. These women, hired on a contractual basis with meagre wages and no employment benefits, often work in adverse conditions. They are responsible for the health quotient of toddlers and children below five years, looking after their education and recording their scale of malnutrition. Often, their work demands long distance travelling and engaging with family members to prepare a database for the government to introduce various schemes.

The event was held in the Kattarpada Primary School, facilitated by Ms. Geetanjali, an *anganwadi sevika* herself. 50 *sevikas* from 20 centres such as Khadaki, Jadhavpada, Mahalpada, Saarshi, Jhadpoli, etc. were invited to the event and share their experiences and views.

The event consisted of three activities:

**Activity 1:** Addressing everyone present on the importance of Women's Day, introducing the Foundation's activities, and recognizing the challenges that *anganwadi sevikas* encounter while performing their duties.

Activity 2: A variety of games geared towards team building, decision making, and uncovering inner potential were organized. A small quiz competition highlighting prominent female personalities was also held. Winners received awards to encourage them to read and learn outside of their regular scale of work.

Activity 3: Each sevika received a beautiful designed bag for her regular use. They were also encouraged to provide feedback on the event and assure us that they would excel in their roles as anganwadi sevikas.

As these *sevikas* do not receive any pension, knowledge of financial literacy and investment planning are essential for them. To address this concern, the Foundation

Many of them were overwhelmed by this celebration organized for them, there was a sense of pride and motivation that 'our efforts are not overlooked by society and we are also equal stakeholders in this world.

During the course of this event, valuable assistance was lent by the Integrated Children Development Scheme (ICDS) of the Government of Maharashtra, as well as its supervisor in-charge, Ms. Suvarna, who certainly deserves a special mention.

KAASH Foundation believes in keeping its promises and honoring its word. In November 2021, KAASH Foundation had pledged to make every effort to eliminate malnutrition among the poor rural children at Vikramgad. In continuation of its promise, on 9th March 2024, KAASH Foundation organized a Distribution Drive for these children at Vikramgad. The Foundation was able to cater to over 70 malnourished children during the event. This was also a special occasion since the Foundation's youngest member Prisha Mayank Podar celebrated her first birthday. Prisha is the daughter of the Foundation's Advisory Committee Member Mr. Mayank Podar and Program Director of Vikramgad Ms. Lippika Mayank Podar.


As part of the drive, nutritional essentials like *chikkis* and *laddoos* made of millets, groundnuts, dry fruits, and *rajgira* were distributed. Milk cakes in the form of *pedhas* were specially ordered from Kutch and distributed. These *pedhas* were carefully prepared with high quality ingredients to ensure a delightful taste and texture. A

peculiar sweet called *mohan thal*, which is made of *gram dal besan* was also distributed. As the children enjoyed these tasty treats, they had a glimpse of the passion and affection that KAASH Foundation showers on them.

It has been three years since KF began this project by adopting 150 children from the village and since then, it has been relentlessly continuing its efforts to address the problem of malnutrition amongst them. It is indeed heartening to see significant improvements in their health indexes.

A special thanks to this year's drive goes to the Podar family, who decided to celebrate their only daughter's first birthday with the children of Vikramgad. While blessings and happiness were showered on little Prisha, she extended it to those who otherwise lived on bleary days. The young couple has carved out a new path in this materialistic world where new parents celebrate the birthdays of their offsprings in pomp and grandeur within the higher echelons of society. Mayank and Lippika, through this, have laid new paradigms in hope that many more young parents will follow suit.

The joy and happiness on the faces of the children of Vikramgad as they partook in



the birthday celebration of little Prisha will be etched in the memory of all those who were present there!
