DR. AVKASH JADHAV'S VISIT TO THE STATE OF ISRAEL

Dr. Avkash Jashav, Founder, Director, KAASH Foundation Mumbai, was invited by the State of Israel and The Embassy of Israel in India for a Special Delegation of Vice Chancellors and Prominent Academicians held in Israel from July 21-25, 2024. This five-day visit aimed to explore education techniques in Israel, promote academic ties, visit Universities of Israel and explore Innovation in education.

Day 01 (22 July 2024) :

The first day of Dr. Avkash's visit started with a small briefing. This was followed by a visit to the place where the Attack of 7th October, 2023 by Hamas in Israel took place. The site has remains of all the Cars, vehicles and Ambulance which were either set on fire, or showered with bullets or were blasted by Hamas. There were detailed descriptions about the vehicles and the casualties. One could also witness an ambulance which was attacked by the terrorist where no one had escaped alive. All vehicles had smashed windshields, big pierced holes of the bullets, some were charred to the core and others stained with blood. In some cases, the people in the vehicles

were burnt to ashes and their DNA samples were collected from the remains to identify them and accordingly last rites were performed.

The second site visit was just 4 km away from the Gaza border. This was the actual site where the brutal attack of October 7, 2023 took place. The delegation's escort was a local resident and victim of the 7 Oct 23 attack. His own family was displaced and his duplex was razed down to ashes. It was the place where almost 100 people were killed. More than 20 communities were hit, killing 1200 people in a single day. The attack was on the community spaces or the Commune or locally called Kibbutz. The social mechanism of Kibbutz is that people from all walks of life come together and they not only share the spaces, but surrender their earnings to the Kibbutz. There is no private property concept and everyone lives in harmony. The site visited had around 1000 people in the house. The terrorists entered these community spaces and randomly opened fire, torched their houses, brutally assaulted young, old and children. Many lives were lost and many houses were torched down. The Kibbutz has retained many houses just the way it is from 7th October 2023 to date. Details of the family members who lost their lives have been displayed. Many members from this Kibbutz were also taken as hostages. In fact the person who was showing us around, his own house was burnt down and his family somehow managed to escape the brutal attack on that day as they hid themselves in the specially designed Secured space (a space in almost all the houses in Israel) of their house. The terrorist razed down his house and flamed the furniture. Many such houses were visited and were a representation of the brutality of the attack and its impact.

Later, the delegation visited the prestigious University of Ben Gurion named after the First Prime Minister of Israel. It is in the South of Israel in Be'er Sheva. They met the Vice President of the University Mr. Dan G Blumberg, who is a space scientist and specializes in Aeronautics and Satellites. He explained with details about the University. His session was followed by Dr. Shimon Barak from the Jacob Blaustein Institute for Desert Research and Dr. Sigal, a geologist. They explained the possible potential of having academic collaborations in various fields. The most interesting part is the

students who pursue their PhD or Postdoc in this University get full tuition waiver and scholarships or stipends. The campus was indeed well designed and has also admitted many Indian students with whom we later on interacted. All their fields of research and especially in Philosophy, Social Sciences and Law were equally impressive. Dr. Avkash was able to meet Dr. Menashi from the history department and discussed the possibilities of some research proposals.

Day 02 (23 July 2024):

On the second day, the delegation drove

towards Jerusalem, the Holy city. They had a meeting with the Indo-Israel Trade and Chamber. Ms. Anat. Bernstein is the Vice President and looks after the Indo-Israel trade operations for more than two decades and who has been following on various projects in India and closely assisting various entrepreneurs in India and Israel to collaborate. Her own firm IBDO encourages various startups. She gave a wonderful presentation with some old photos of our Hon.Prime Minister Shri. Narendra Modi, almost 16 yrs old. It was a meeting which indeed made the delegation feel proud and

more connected to the industries in Israel. The well known drip irrigation initiative in India is a collaboration of companies from Israel. There are many more collaborations in the field of Food and agriculture.

The next visit was to the meticulously crafted Museum on Holocaust. This museum, in fact, takes us through the trail of the era of Holocaust and the atrocities committed on Jews in Europe during 1935 to 1944. The highest number of Jews during that time were eliminated in Poland. It also had a display of the art of propaganda of Hitler, the details of the entire administrative and professional machinery which was involved to eliminate the Jews, the different anecdotes of survivors, the remains of the Jews after their annihilation - like shoes, documents, bags, photos etc. The museum also had a replica of the Auschwitz camp of Poland. The documentation along with various verified facts has become the testimony of the Final Solution of Hitler.

The next visit was the Nova ground where 364 were gunned down. The people who had come to enjoy the Nova festival on 7 October, 2023 and ended up facing a very brutal attack on them. The place now has become a memorial ground, dedicated to the people who lost their lives and were taken as hostages. The family members have now posted their photos and regularly light candles on the site.

The next visit was to one of the oldest Universities of Israel - Hebrew University. The university boasts of Five Nobel prize winners. Some of the stalwarts of this university are Albert Einstein and Sigmund Freud. The engagement and discussion with Dr. Naomi and Dr. Michal Goldberg helped understand the courses they offer and their contribution in the field of research. It was interesting to know that they also have a program on Digital Humanities. The visit to the Archives of Albert Einstein in the campus was proof that Albert Einstein had personally known many Indians, mainly Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore, Jawaharlal Nehru and he was equally an admirer of Mahatma Gandhi. The archives are located on the campus of Hebrew University and with free access to all.

The next stop was to visit the Holy city of God. The place where Jesus Christ was, crucified and had final resurrection.The place where Lord Jesus Christ was crucified, the stone slab where the Cross was poled,

the broken slab of resurrection, various old paintings etc, all those connected to the Lord are indeed very well maintained and open for visitors and worshippers from

around the world. We finally went to the famous Western Wall. The wall has a very significant position for people who have faith in the almighty.

Day 3 - 24th July 2024

Day 03 (24 July 2024):

The delegation was invited on the third day to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs office where it met the Asia Pacific Coordinators and Officers overlooking the Indo-Israel relationship. Inputs about different sectors where the countries are coordinating and exchanging ideas for development were given.

Post lunch session included visiting the famous Technion University, which is the epicenter of various breakthrough research in the field of agriculture, sci-fi experiments, using the technology for the aid of mankind, aerospace, humanities and various facets of unconventional discoveries. The university has a wide spread campus overlooking the sea and is supposedly taking good care of their students.

The last leg of the day was a heritage walk of the New and old Haifa City. They toured around the Baha'i temple which is an architectural marvel, a wide view of the Mediterranean sea overlooking its largest port (which interestingly is under the Adani group of India positioning 60% of the claim of the port), a large iron canon overlooking the sea with a commemorative for King Kaiser Wilhelm II of Germany, etc.

The final schedule was to visit the Memorial in Haifa dedicated to Indian soldiers. The record at the memorial states that 29 soldiers of the Indian army are buried in this cemetery, who fought during World War I. They belonged to the 97th Deccan Infantry, 121st Pioneers Sepoys, 29th Lancers Deccan Horses and First Duke of York Own Horses, Skinners Horse. It was a matter of great pride to visit this site which is very well maintained by the government of Israel and also displays our long standing association with this country. The day ended with a drive back to Tel Aviv.

Day 04 (25 July 2024):

The final day of the tour started with an academic visit to the Tel Aviv University (TAU). The delegation was greeted by Mr. Konstantin Platonov and Dr. Milette Shamir at the University. The elaborate discussions made the delegation realize that the potential of higher education is immense in Israel. Their academic track record was really impressive. Dr. Avkash then bid farewell to all the group members as he had to take his flight from Tel Aviv airport Terminal 2 at 4.00 pm.



HEALTH AWARENESS SEMINAR FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

KAASH Foundation under its KAASH Swasthya Manthan, organised a Health Seminar on 2nd July 2024 at Rashtriya Shala Hall, Gandhi Chowk, Vile Parle from 04:00 pm to 05:00 pm. The esteemed speaker for the seminar was Mr. Alkesh Shah, Associate Joint Director (Health), KAASH Foundation. This seminar was organised on the request of the senior citizens who participated in the Foundation's previous seminar on 12th May, 2024. Since only a segment of the seminar was dedicated to Sujok therapy, the participants requested Mr. Alkesh Shah for a special seminar focused solely on Sujok. The participants on 2nd July were majorly middle-aged and senior citizens from VALDO.

Mr. Alkesh Shah began the session by introducing Sujok therapy and explaining how many health emergencies can be dealt with naturally without medication. Sujok therapy is a relatively lesser-known alternative healing practice originating from Korea. "Su" means hand and "Jok" means foot in Korean. This therapy is based on the principle that the hands and feet contain energy points corresponding to all organs and areas of the body.

For senior and middle-aged citizens, Mr Shah expounded how Sujok therapy can offer several potential benefits. It is noninvasive and can be used to address various health issues common in older adults, such as joint pain, digestive problems, and circulatory issues. Practitioners claim it can help improve overall energy levels, reduce stress, and promote better sleep. He elucidated with demonstration, how the therapy involves stimulating specific points on the hands and feet using small objects, pressure, or heat, which may be particularly appealing to older adults looking for gentle, drug-free treatment options.

The seminar was widely applauded. The audience appreciated and thanked the efforts of Mr. Alkesh Shah and KAASH Foundation for organising this Health Awareness Seminar.

EMPOWERING YOUNG MINDS: A HEALTH AWARENESS SESSION

As Mahatma Gandhi once said, "Be the change you wish to see in the world." Driven by this profound belief, Dr. Renuka Vyas, Director of the Health Vertical at Kaash, took part in an enlightening session as Naturopath Speaker on September 21, 2024. Hosted by the Stree Mandal organization in South Mumbai's Sikanagar area at VP road, this event focused on fostering health and wellness among young girls aged 5 to 15. Stree Mandal, a non-profit dedicated to women's empowerment, emphasizes upskilling women as a key to their progress, and this awareness session was a perfect reflection of their goals.

The talk, led by Dr. Vyas, centered on the importance of mental strength and its role as a vital life skill. Known for her expertise in holistic health, Dr. Vyas made sure her discussion was approachable and relatable for the young audience. She began by teaching the younger girls about essential elements of health, such as the significance of vitamins, a balanced diet, and the importance of staying hydrated. Recognizing the role parents play in a child's lifestyle, Dr. Vyas also highlighted the value of proper parental guidance in promoting a healthier way of living.

One of the session's most heartwarming moments came when a curious young girl asked, "Why can my parents eat things I can't?" Dr. Vyas warmly welcomed the question, using it as an opportunity to explain the importance of nutritional differences between adults and children, offering a simple yet insightful answer that engaged the entire room.

As the discussion broadened, Dr. Vyas addressed the unique concerns of the older girls, particularly those entering puberty. She stressed the importance of physical health, regular exercise, proper breathing, and the practice of meditation to maintain mental balance. Recognizing the modern challenges these girls face, Dr. Vyas also discussed the effects of excessive gadget use, focusing on how it can impact their

overall well-being.

Interestingly, one recurring question that caught Dr. Vyas's attention was the girls' curiosity about hair health. Many young participants were eager to learn how to strengthen and lengthen their hair.She explained the importance of protein intake for hair growth and cautioned against excessive cheese consumption while emphasizing the benefits of lime water in their diet.

The true measure of a successful session is the engagement and interest of the audience, and this event was no exception. Initially planned for 45 minutes, the session stretched well beyond an hour and a half, as the girls' curiosity and enthusiasm kept the conversation alive. Pravin Behen, a member of Stree Mandal, remarked, "We didn't expect the children to sit for more than 30 minutes, but this session helped them grow as individuals."

In the end, the event was not just an awareness session, it was a celebration of learning, growth, and development. Dr. Vyas and Stree Mandal's initiative has paved the way for future collaborations, bringing Kaash closer to its vision of societal development and empowerment. With such initiatives, it becomes evident that the right guidance at the right time can truly shape a child's future for the better.






